- 1. Any incident of engine overheating will result in the termination of your charter, without compensation;
- 2. Your group will vacate the vessel immediately to allow for repairs to be conducted:
- 3. The costs of recovery of the vessel will be charged to your damage deposit; and
- 4. All costs of repairs to the boat, recovery back to our docks will be charged to your damage deposit.

- Warranty of competence:
 - a) The Charterer hereby warrants and certifies that he is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age, that he understands and is competent in the navigation of the class of Vessel, the subject hereof, and is capable of properly operating the equipment provided. Provided that if such warranties are not given hereby, the Charterer hereby undertakes to engage, and give command of the Vessel to a qualified skipper, approved by the Owner.
 - b) Charterer has reviewed the prepared charter information our website "https://www.islandcruising.ca/preapare-for-charter"
- SECURITY DEPOSIT: This deposit will be held by ISLAND CRUISING LTD and will be returned to the 4) CHARTERER within 14 days of completion of the Rental, less any costs or charges.
- 5) **RETURN OF VESSEL:**
 - a) The vessel shall be returned to its berthing location on time for termination of this cruise. It shall be free of all liens or encumbrances (inclusive of Customs clearance, if applicable, but except for salvage liens) and shall be clean, in good general condition, and fully equipped. (Ordinary wear and tear resulting from proper use accepted)
- LOSS OR DAMAGE: 6)
 - a) In the event of loss or damage, ISLAND CRUISING LTD, must be contacted immediately and no attempt to carry out repairs must be made. All liability insurance will cease should the charterer fail to comply with the reporting, or to complete an insurance incident report to initiate a claim.
 - b) The Charterer agrees to a pre-authorized payment for PERSONAL & PUBLIC LIABILITY, HULL AND MACHINERY INSURANCE COVER;
 - i) This damage deposit will cover the deductible in the event of damages or loss caused by the charterer.
 - ii) 100% of the security deposit will be forfeited with any grounding. The Owner reserves the right to terminate the charter immediately.
 - iii) The charterer is responsible for any loss or damage not covered by the insurance resulting from operation of the yacht in breach of this agreement or the insurance policy.
 - iv) Full charter fees are payable in the event of damage before the charter completion as a result of the negligent act by the charterer. Should this render the yacht unavailable for succeeding charters, the charterer will be responsible for the lost charter fees or costs of an alternate yacht.

c) The options herein are subject to the rights of the insurer of the vessel and hereinbefore mentioned. Any monies due after this clause, shall, if not paid on demand, bear interest.

7) SHORTAGES:

a) The vessel shall be delivered to the charterer with fuel and portable water tanks topped up and all equipment necessary to charter in place as per the inventory list. The charterer shall return the vessel to the owner or his management agent at the expiration of the cruise, similarly topped up and with all the said equipment in place and in good working order, or in default thereof, pays to the owner for any shortages or repairs at the current retail price.

8) OPERATION OF THE VESSEL:

- a) The charterer hereby undertakes to operate the vessel for purposes of pleasure cruising only, and in accordance with the undernoted principles, and with any additional rules or regulations made by the Owner or his agent:
 - i) The Vessel shall be operated in accordance with Canadian Maritime Law insofar as the same applies to small vessels, as well as in such a manner as shall not impair any insurance policy covering the vessel.
 - ii) The vessel shall be used where applicable under any special rules or directions given by the Owner.
 - iii) The vessel shall at all times be well clear of commercial shipping.
 - iv) Subject to any directions given by the Owner as set out herein, the vessel shall not be operated:
 - (1) In fog; or
 - (2) Whilst unsafe to do so on account of weather or any other factors; or
 - (3) Between the hours of sunset and sunrise; or
 - (4) Outside the coastal water of British Columbia and North West Washington bounded by lines drawn between the following points: Cape Flattery and Owen Point, Cape Sutil and Mexican Point, Cape James and Allison Harbour; or
 - (5) On the coastal waters and inlets of the West Coast of Vancouver Island between Owen Point and Cape Sutil; or
 - (6) On the Fraser River above the mouth of the Sumas River.
 - v) The vessel shall not be used for, nor engage in racing, whether formal or informal, except as permitted by the owner or his authorized representative.
 - vi) The vessel shall not at any time be overloaded, or operated by any person under the influence of alcohol or any drugs.
 - vii) The vessel shall not be used for carriage of goods or animals, or for the carriage of passengers for hire nor for the conduct of commercial purposes of any kind.
 - viii) The charterer shall not permit pet animals of any kind on the vessel at any time.
 - ix) The charterer shall not permit smoking, whether pipe, cigarettes or otherwise howsoever, below decks.
- b) The charterer shall not permit the vessel to be used to import into the United States or its territorial waters, any controlled drugs or drug paraphernalia in contravention of United States law.
